

## **Admissions**

The District Vice President of Admissions and Records, under the direction of the Vice Chancellor, Workforce Development and Educational Services, is responsible for District admission, residency, and concurrent enrollment admission procedures.

California state law mandates that every student who applies for admission must provide residency information to determine the student's residency classification for fee purposes. (Administrative Regulation 5015)

### **Age and/or High School Graduation Requirement**

In general, all students must have earned a high school diploma, a *State Certificate of Proficiency*, or the equivalent; or be 18 years of age.

### **Concurrent Enrollment of High School Students**

Students who are under 18 years of age who have not earned a high school diploma, a *State Certificate of Proficiency*, or the equivalent will only be admitted in accordance with the "concurrent enrollment" procedures. (Administrative Regulation 5011)

### **International Students**

International students must obtain a special application that will be mailed upon request from the International Student Office, located on each college campus. (Administrative Regulation 5012)

Applicants may apply for college admission on-line by going to our website or by completing a paper *Registration Application*.

Admission, residency, and concurrent enrollment procedures are listed in detail in each college/center catalog and schedule of classes.
