Mr. Cantu reported on topics of interest from Fresno City College. Copies of the report were provided for the Board and interested attendees, and contained the following highlights:

- Dr. Jothany Blackwood, dean of instruction for fine, performing and communication arts, was a keynote speaker for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) community fundraiser.
- English instructor Lee Herrick will have a second book of poetry published.
- FCC Associated Student Body President, Cindy Quiralte, is a highly requested speaker. She recently presented at several conferences and workshops. She was invited to speak at the 40th Annual Chicano Youth Conference at Fresno State on February 11 at which she presented three workshops on Chicana feminism to 3 different groups of girls, from 8th grade to high school seniors, from the Central Valley. Cindy has also been selected to attend the UC Riverside Puente Leadership Summit on March 26-29 for the UC Riverside Latinos in Education Advocacy Day (LEAD), an Hispanic Serving Intuition round table focusing on providing more student voices at the national level.
- Art Space Gallery hosts Art instructor, Kathy Wosika, who will be retiring in May. A new exhibit of her work, The Spiritual Beat: Rhythms and Patterns, is now on display in the Art Space Gallery through March 29. The work in this exhibit will represent more than 30 years of creative explorations in both clay and handmade paper constructions.

This year's Madera endeavor was the Riverwalk Improvement Project at which the volunteers spread mulch along a two mile section of the walking trail, saving the City of Madera over \$8,000. Board of Trustee member Richard Caglia and Madera Dean of Students Monica Cuevas were among the many leaders contributing their time and services to help assist in the project. Willow International Center held their first foster youth orientation and registration event on February 27th. Ten foster youth individuals were provided orientation, financial aid information, counseling, a tour of the campus, and an opportunity to hear a former foster youth student speaker. The event was a collaborative effort between Willow International, CSU Fresno, Fresno County Department of Social Services, Fresno County Office of Education, and Clovis Unified School District. The eighth annual oxford style debate will be held on March 29 at 7:00 p.m. at the Willow International Center. The debate is presented by the North Centers' Honors Program and Willow International Center swill be holding their fourth annual employee service awards ceremony on Thursday, April 26th at the Madera Center. Employees will be recognized for their years of service.
Chancellor's Report	 Dr. Blue reported the following: The Districtwide Strategic Planning Charette took place on March 1 in the OAB. Over 100 business, education, community, non-profit and elected officials attended. They provided critical feedback on the current strategic plan, as well as input for the 2012-2016 strategic plan. Under the leadership of Dr. Jothany Blackwood and the newly constituted district strategic planning committee, analysis of data collected from the charette will be used for the development of the 2012-2016 strategic plan. The search committee for President of Fresno City College comprised of faculty, staff, students, administration, community members, and representatives from the Board of Trustees narrowed the competition to three finalists. They are: Mr. Arturo Reyes, executive vice president of academic and student affairs at Solano Community College District; Mr. Anthony Cantu, interim president at Fresno City College; and Dr. George Railey, vice president of academic services at Chabot College in the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District. All three candidates will participate in public forums to be held March 12-14 in the Old Administration Building. A search is underway for the recruitment of the Willow International campus president. This comes as a result of a recommendation during the accreditation/candidacy process at Willow International. Open forums were held last week at Willow International to gather input for

Chancellor's Report (continued)	 the candidate profile. Dr. Pam Fisher from ACCT will be coordinating the search. The Little Hoover Commission released its report on community colleges last week. The report, titled <i>Serving Students, Serving California</i>, includes recommendations for community colleges including re-thinking the community college mission, student success and access, governance at the state level, and funding models that are predictable and linked to goal. We have invited Senator Michael Rubio, a Little Hoover commissioner, to come to our district and participate in a panel discussion regarding the commission's findings and recommendations. Trustee boundaries adopted by the Board in December have been approved by the U.S. Department of Justice. This concludes the district's work in the redistricting process for the 2010 census. She commended the Board for the open and inclusive way it conducted the process. The final trustee maps can be found on the district website. A special scholarship fundraiser will take place on April 17 at Willow International to honor Dr. Terry Kershaw.
Academic Senate Report	 Mr. Jeff Ragan, Reedley College Academic Senate president, reported on topics of interest, which included the following highlights: At the February 14 meeting, the senate discussed general education learning Outcomes, blended degree outcomes, Willow International progress towards candidacy, NCFA activities, Department of Labor Grant- C6- CTE, and the SCCCD/RC strategic planning committees. Mr. Ragan reported on the SCCCD strategic conversation, summer school 2012, and an accreditation status letter from Dr. Capet. At the February 28 meeting, the senate reviewed administrative regulation 2410. Mr. Ragan reported on his attendance at the academic academy conference in Los Angeles, sponsored by the state academic senate. Mr. Ragan recognized the faculty coordination between Willow International and Reedley College in the formation of Willow International sub-committees as they move towards their own academic senates. Associated Student Body	Ms. Kayla Urbano, Reedley College Associated Student Body President, presented a slide show highlighting the student activity events that have taken place since September 2011.
Reedley College Programs	Public Information Officer Lucy Ruiz introduced several Reedley College students, administrators and instructors who presented information on several programs at Reedley College, including e-business, mechanized agriculture, forestry and natural resources, aviation maintenance technology, the Pete P. Peters honors program, veterans services, the K- 16 bridge program, college readiness, Reg-to-Go, STEM, and C6.
	Mr. Smith asked if Reedley College kept statistics on the success rate of veterans. Michael White stated a report will be provided at the conclusion of the spring semester.
Facilities Master Planning Progress Update	Brian Speece reviewed the progress of the facilities master planning, the schedule of events, and the meetings with constituencies groups that have taken place to date. Mr. Speece reviewed the goals, including: addressing the needs of the Educational Master Plan; growth projections, prioritize projects; replace portable buildings with permanent facilities, develop sites and facilities to attract students, encourage students and community members to spend time on campus, incorporate sustainable design principles in all development, consider life cycle costs and reduce maintenance needs, address ADA issues, and increase accessibility. Mr. Speece reviewed the enrollment growth and space analysis for all sites, as well as the districtwide master plan facility guidelines and standards. Mr. Speece recognized Christine Miktarian, SCCCD manager of construction services, who has worked on the plan. He introduced Paul Halajian, Marty Dietz and Bob Pettihomme, from Darden and Associates, who presented a detailed report for each district site.
	Mr. Speece stated the draft of the facilities master plan report will be presented to the Board during the retreat. The report will then be presented to the campus communities and community at large during town hall meetings for final input. The final plan will be brought to the board for approval during the August meeting.
	Ms. Smith asked if earthquake preparedness is built into the equations. Mr. Speece said it is a requirement by the Department of State Architects

Mr. Patterson stated he received an informal opinion from a retired attorney general who said it does not require a majority of the Board to request an opinion of the Attorney General regarding deliberating in closed session regarding the appointment of a personnel commissioner.

A motion was made by Ms. Barreras and seconded by Ms. Smith that the Board of Trustees appoint Ms. Melinda Rodriguez to the Personnel Commission.

Mr. Patterson stated he has concerns about the process. He is concerned that the recommended appointee does not have satisfactory managerial experience. He is also concerned about her involvement with CSEA. He will not support this appointee.

Ms. Barreras stated the Board adopted the process and appointed the subcommittee of three board members. She says this is disrespectful to the sub-committee that was appointed by the Board.

Mr. Patterson said he has a right to support to approve the candidate of his choice, and not necessarily one recommended by the committee.
