Technology Task Force Charge

It is the charge of this Technology Task Force to develop and recommend the elements of a comprehensive technology plan for the district and to further recommend the composition of a Standing District Technology Committee.

While the initial work should focus on the recommendations made by Campus Work and updating the District Technology Plan, the long-range goal is to establish a flexible output based technology plan. This plan should be based on the specifics of what students, staff, faculty and administration want to be able to do with technology rather than input measures such as number of machines we need. Once we know what output is desired from the college community, then the goal of the technology committee is to provide options that best meet those output goals. The Technology Task Force will recommend the best composition for a District Technology Committee to identify the output goals and to formulate the technology options to be presented to the Chancellor's Cabinet.

The initial work of the technology task force is:

1. Review the report from Campus Works and develop a prioritized list of recommendations to be submitted to the Chancellor's Cabinet.
2. Update the District Technology Strategic Plan from 2000 to develop an annual District Strategic Technology Plan that is aligned with the District Strategic Plan, District Resource Allocation Model and District Human Resources Plan.

2. Update the District Technology Strategic Plan from 2000 to develop an annual District Strategic Technology Plan that is integrated with the District's Mission and Goals, District Strategic Plan, District Resource Allocation Model, District Human Resources Plan and Campus Technology Plans.
3. Set up timelines and objectives to be completed by the taskforce prior to transitioning to a standing districtwide technology committee.
4. Integrate/consider Accreditation Standard III as it relates to technology
5. Review other multi-college district's technology plans
6. Transition to a full standing Technology Committee after the taskforce completes its initial goals
