## Scorecard Replaces ARCC

- The Scorecard replaces the (2004 AB 1417) Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC) Report.
- Specific categories, or "momentum points," function as key indicators of student success.
- These are based on progress over six years.


## Scorecard Guidelines for Interaction with the Board of Trustees Education Code, Section 84754.5(d)

- "As a condition of receiving specified funds in the annual Budget Act, each community college district board of trustees shall annually review and adopt its contribution to the segment wide annual report as part of a regularly scheduled and noticed public meeting at which public comment shall be invited."
- Board minutes due no later than March 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ (link to Board minutes due by March 16).
- The board minutes should include:
- Reference to the Scorecard and the specific report's year (e.g., the 2013 Scorecard)
- Reference to the areas or metrics discussed in the Scorecard (e.g., completion rate overall, remedial rate for Hispanics students, etc.).
- Reaction, including questions and comments, from board of trustee members.


## Presentation of Student Success Scorecard Data

- Compares each college against its own past performance from the Accountability Reporting for Community Colleges.
- Is broken down by race, ethnicity, gender, and age.
- Provides clear data on student success that supports closing performance gaps.
- Provides increased institutional performance transparency to internal and external stakeholders.


## Scorecard Metrics \& Definitions

- Persistence Rate - the percentage of students seeking a degree or transfer to a four-year school who remain enrolled for three consecutive terms
- 30 Unit Rate - the percentage of first-time students seeking a degree or transfer who earn at least 30 units
- Student Progress and Attainment Rate - the percentage of degree-ortransfer seeking students - separated into cohorts of those who start in basic skills and those who begin in college-level classes - who earn a degree, earn a certificate or transfer to a four-year college or university


## Scorecard Metrics \& Definitions

- Basic Skills Progress Rate - the percentage of students who start out in remedial classes who go on to succeed in college-level courses
- Career Technical Education - the percentage of students who complete a career technical education program and earn a degree, earn a certificate or transfer
