- RCAS is currently reviewing the RC Cycle 4 Program Review Handbook and Distance Education Strategic Plan
- Beginning the process of reviewing their constitution and bylaws looking at more inclusion of Madera and Oakhurst.

Jeff Burdick reported the following: The Willow Academic Senate will be focused on three things over the next month:

- 1. The district documents coming for approval
- 2. The election of officers for the next two academic years
- 3. The completion and ratification of the amended

constitution and bylaws.

The state wide steering committee of the common assessment initiative met for the first time last week for a day-long organizational meeting. The committee and staff are well organized and have excellent plans for exploring multiple measures, assessment tests, and the technology to support the state-wide assessment of students in support of the student success plan. Mr. Burdick believes that he will be working on the multiple measures task force, though committee assignments are not yet established. He will be presenting an update to the state senate's plenary session next month.

The state academic senate's diversity task force continues its work. He will be presenting a session on difficult conversations about race, ethnicity, and gender at the plenary session.

Mary Ann Valentino report the FCC academic senate did not approve the districtwide facilities committee operating agreement. She stated the senate is also working on updating their bylaws.

Leslie Rata state the Willow International classified senate is focusing on fundraising for scholarships and reviewing districtwide documents. The senate will be attending the state wide classified senate conference in June. senate positions are due today. The senate is participating in Safari Days at RC. The classified Mega conference will take place on April 15.

Lacy Barnes stated negotiations will take place today. She recently returned from the CFT annual convention where a resolution on course repeatability was passed by the convention body. This Board of Governors change created to address matriculation and student success has had unintended consequences that detrimentally impacts students and their success. CFT is working on a campaign to encourage the BOG to reevaluate this change.

Tony Cantu stated several performance and music events are taking place at FCC throughout the month of April. 90 students from Fresno Unified will be on campus to visit the applied technology division. Showcase starts on Thursday. It is also disability awareness day. FCC is hosting a blood drive.

Jan Dekker stated the Green Summit will take place on April 24 at Reedley College. The STEM conference will take place on April 26. It will be the largest in the Valley.
